Dear YMCA Friends,

The year 2021 stands out as a pivotal one for the YMCA of Greater Des Moines. While dealing with the physical, emotional, business and financial challenges presented by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, your Y doubled down on our mission work, powered by the renewed energy and creativity of our dedicated staff and volunteers.

Our Association began the year by partnering with more than 100 Ys throughout the country to bring the STRONG Challenge to Greater Des Moines. Nearly 700 people participated in this virtual six-week program to improve their health in spirit, mind and body.

A unique Water Watchers initiative put a community-wide emphasis on promoting water safety during this year's outdoor swim season. Staff provided training materials and led off-site presentations for adults and youth alike, supported by a series of water safety public service announcements through our partnership with Des Moines Radio Group stations.

During such a racially divisive year, the annual Martin Luther King Jr. Prayer Breakfast was needed more than ever. Our socially responsible theme, "Healing Together," drew 500 webinar participants and was beautifully conveyed by Cris Carter, former NFL star and Hall of Famer, and a panel of young community leaders on the forefront of the racial justice movement.

And, The Chrysalis Foundation partnered to support the Y's Girls on the Run of Central Iowa with LUNAFEST, a traveling film festival by and about women.

Our efforts toward long-term sustainability gained huge momentum this year with a highly engaged board of directors and a strategic planning process resulting in three key areas of continued study: Creating an innovative and diverse mix of revenue, refining what it truly means to be a Y member, and providing the best of what the Y has to offer tailored to the needs of our community.

It was truly a year of Changing Lives that was only possible through the support and generosity of the communities we serve. Please come by any of our branches to view our new tribute to our many donors and the ways they change lives every day.

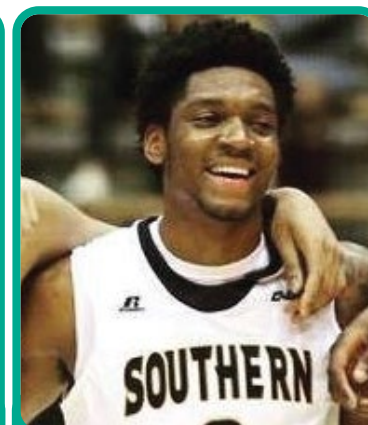

The John R. Grubb YMCA is located in one of Des Moines' most economically disadvantaged neighborhoods. For many of the kids who grow up there, "the Grubb" is a home away from home, a place where they can do schoolwork, hang out with friends and make connections with adults who become mentors and role models. Kids like Galat, a newcomer to the U.S. who is the first member of his family to earn a college degree ... Kourtlin, a regular at the Y's Saturday Night Live program who now works as a youth mentor while pursuing a career as an athletic director ... Shareece, whose experiences playing and working at the Y helped her become a college coach ... and Jontae, a Y kid who now mentors students at East High School.

NEVER TOO LATE

After a decade away from the Y, TJ Woods rejoined to gain back the strength he lost as a result of a difficult spinal surgery. He tried a little bit of everything – yoga and barre classes, power cycle, water aerobics – and, for the first time in his life, took up running. At the age of 69, with his Y family cheering him on, TJ completed his first full marathon, just two minutes shy of Boston qualifying time. “The Y helped me believe that age is just a number, and it’s never too late to make positive changes in my physical and mental life,” he said.

A PLACE TO CALL HOME

At YMCA Supportive Housing Campus, we believe the solution to the problem of homelessness starts with the basics: providing permanent housing where people can feel safe, supported and accepted.

Cory, a Marine Corps veteran, had a bad reaction to a drug and suffered a psychotic break, which affected his behavior to the point that he lost his home and ended up in jail. The Veterans Administration provided clinical and psychological support to help him heal, but Cory still needed a place to live. At Y-SHC, Cory has found a community of caring and services to help him make a fresh start. He once again has a job, and is working toward his other life goals.

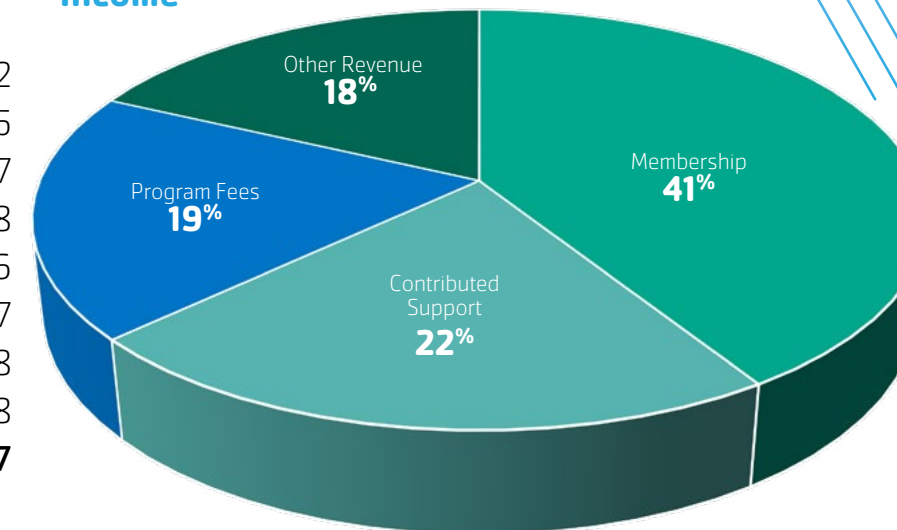

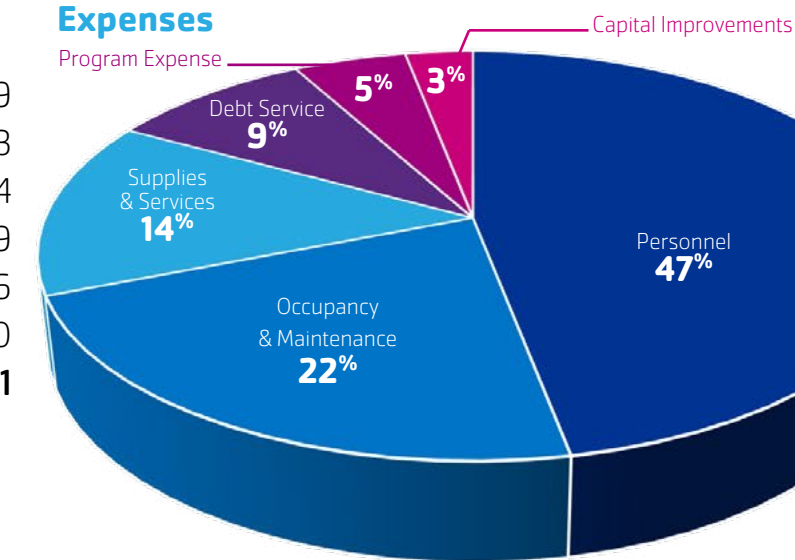

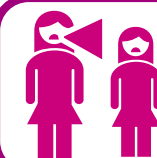
